STANDARD TERMS

1. STANDARD ADMINISTRATIVE TERMS

General Grants Management

2. Award Acceptance - Initial withdrawal of funds by the recipient, constitutes acceptance of the terms and conditions of this award. Any future support is subject to the availability of funds and programmatic priorities. 4.
