<p>B. Trauma Subcommittee Dr. Doug Schuerer, Chair</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dr. Schuerer introduced himself as a Reg 7 trauma conference representative. His remarks included he will review transport and trauma protocols. Although trauma is part of TCD system, the proposed trauma regulations have not been approved. Level IV trauma centers were identified in the proposed regs but after 30 meetings the issue is still in limbo. CDC guidelines were used to add ATVs. Trauma Subcommittee has pushed the state to approve the trauma regs. Dr. Schuerer said the evidence has not changed. • Dr. Schuerer said he was notified that the trauma subcommittee chair has been changed to Dr. David Gustafson. Dr. Schuerer thinks changing the chair to a person who is not dedicated just to trauma is a mistake. Dr. Andrews told Dr. Schuerer that he was valued member and she valued his contributions. Dr. Andrews said she appointed Dr. Gustafson to get EMS back at the table with the trauma subcommittee. She hopes the trauma nurse coordinators will continue to work attend meetings and help guide the efforts. Dr. Andrews indicated she wants Dr. Schuerer work on the data points project. Pam Jackson commented trauma needs to be led by those who understand trauma and she believes it needs to be hospital led. The question was raised on the mission of SAC regarding trauma—is it only the EMS aspect? Dr. Andrews responded saying SAC’s mission is to advise on EMS which includes the prehospital and hospital care. And there is a broader scope as well to include SEMA, public health and public education. All need to work together to coordinate efforts of make EMS better on all levels. Pam Jackson reiterated that she thinks it is important the trauma subcommittee be led by a trauma person. Dr. Andrews acknowledged her viewpoint and impressed on all attending that her goal is to have all disciplines at the table for trauma subcommittee meetings. 		
<p>C. Legislative Subcommittee Mark Alexander, Chair</p>	<p>Mark Alexander reported that the legislative subcommittee is working to advise DHSS as all EMS regulations are being reviewed. There was a meeting Nov. 14 at Boone County Fire</p>		


	<p>Protection District in Columbia that was attended in person and on line. About 35 people participated. Reviewed data collection regulation .375 which has been completed and approved but because of nature of state computer servers the data collection cannot take place at this time. Presently, only life threats reported. When .375 goes into effect there will be changes:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. All patient encounters will be required to be reported 2. Must upload reports to state and 3. Uploads must take place in timely manner. <p>A rolling 14-day reporting window has been established.</p> <p>The patient care hand-off issue will be pulled from this regulation and put in a separate one. Patient safety is a concern if hand-off information is not accurate. <i>Ruby Mehrer moved to accept .375 as revised. Ben Chlapek seconded the motion. No further discussion. The motion passed.</i></p> <p>At the November 14th meeting the regulations for licensing ground, air and EMRAs were combined. Documents are posted on the MEMSA website www.memsa.org and can be commented on there. There are still things that are unique to each entity that will be left intact. Insurance requirements may be adjusted as this process continues.</p> <p>Communicable disease regulations are being combined into one regulation. Deemed consent is already included in language so treatment for exposed health care workers should not be delayed.</p> <p>The SE region has indicated the pending trauma regs need to be updated.</p> <p>Next meeting to work on revising/updating/combining regulations is 2nd Tues in Jan. Starting with that meeting, the group will meet every 2 weeks until spring. Any interested person can attend and participate.</p>

E. East Central	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dr. Doug Schuerer said Helen Sandkuhl asked to bring forward the issue of collecting evidence based data. AHA has ability to gather stroke and STEMI data. Dr. Schuerer says there is a need to collect other data. He said East Central has been talking to vendors for data collection. • Vendors can filter for EMS data only if wanted. Dr. Schuerer said there is a need to gather data on state level. He questioned if others have interest in participating and helping to pay for the efforts. Jason White said MARCER/Reg A would be interested in looking at it. Art Maxwell indicated the issue should be taken back to the regions for consideration. • Dr. Schuerer asked if there was interest in having a vendor(s) attend a meeting for discussion and explanation. • Bill Koebel says always interested in having data but would not be able to commit DHSS. • There was further discussion on how the data could be collected, whether or not it could pull from hospitals and EMS and what detail it could give. Cost was cited as a factor to deal with, but most comments were positive in supporting the project and wanted an opportunity to vet some of the resources available. • Terry Ellsworth indicated that currently the state only gets data on about 10% of EMS calls because life-threats only are required to be reported. He also said data collection for demographics and billing is very different. He would be interested in data that could be compared on a local, regional or state level. • Dr. Schuerer will follow up by inviting a vendor(s) to come to the January SAC meeting, • East Central TCD conf had around 100 or so attend. • There is a concern about communication with EMS in East Central. Some have indicated EMS does not receive communication from the group. There are ongoing efforts to correct this. • East Central is waiting to have vacancies on the committee filled. The data is being collected for EMSC grant. Two reminders have gone out. So far there is a 72% return. At least an 80% return on survey is the goal. • Mr. Ellsworth reminded the group that two representatives from each Region should be identified to be on EMSC committee. 	<p>Agencies are reminded to complete the survey.</p> <p>Each region should identify two people for EMSC and submit to Terry Ellsworth.</p>	
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Center for Patient Safety Lee Varner	<p>Lee Varner unable to attend today. He sent a report:</p> <p>We are currently working on the 2018 schedule and will share that with the SAC at the next meeting. One thing I want to do in 2018 is to attend the regional meetings around the state and offer a short presentation on patient safety. In the past our messaging has been primarily focused on PSO, however, we would now like to include greater information on patient safety/safety culture.</p>		

Educational Presentation: George Wright, EMS Memorial Project			
George reported NW MO State University has offered a 99-year lease for a site to establish the EMS Memorial on that campus. A 501c3 corporation is being established to be able to receive donations and to oversee the project. George said the memorial would honor the 27 MO LODD. There will be a process established to add names in the future for those lost in the line of duty as well as a way for others to be honored. Fundraising goal is \$142,000 George said the goal to open the memorial is 2020.
